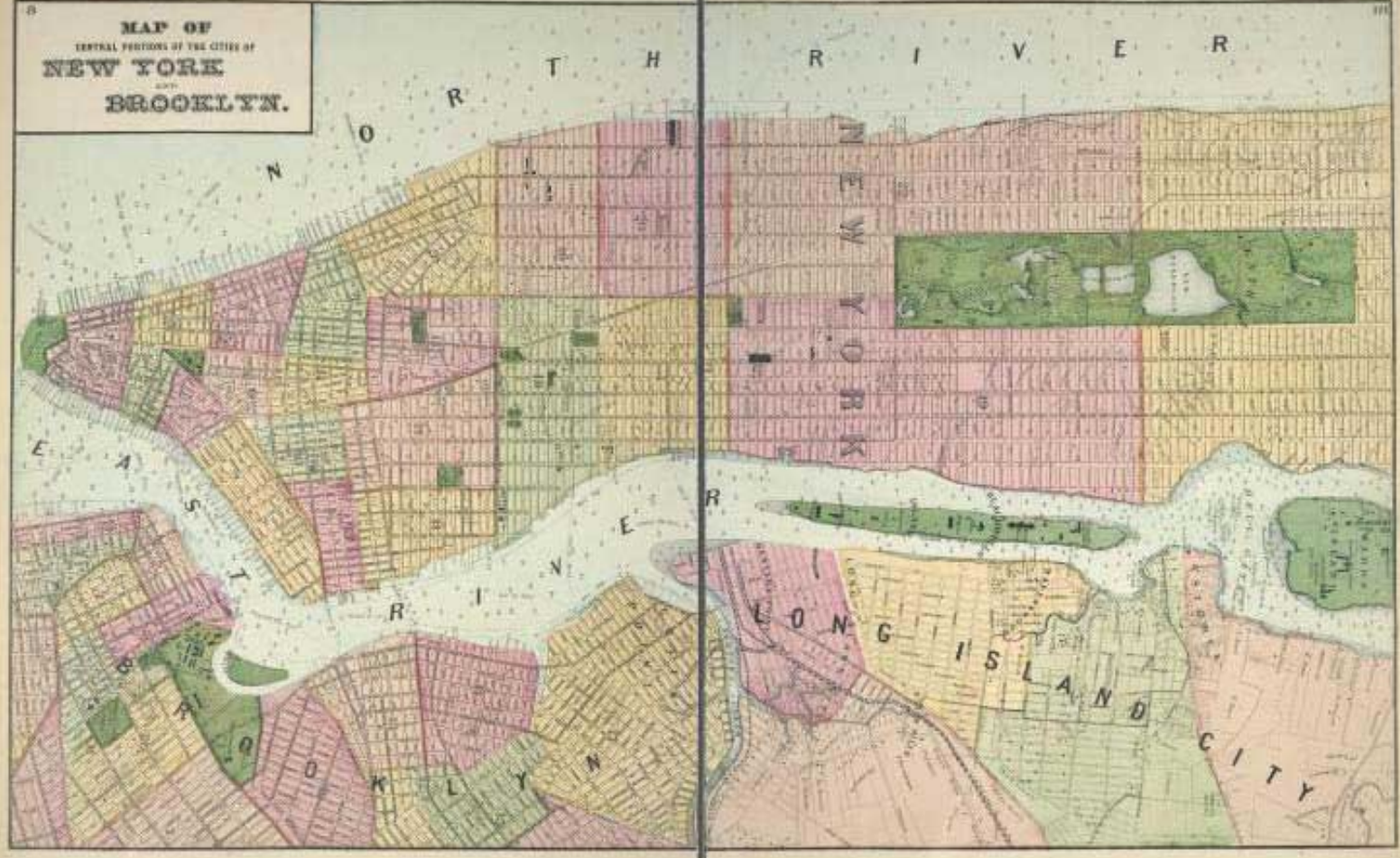

An extension to Babylon and thence to the now favorite summer resort at Fire Island, is contemplated; also an extension to Port Jefferson; on the completion of these two branches this road will touch nearly all the important points on Long Island.



The Equipment and Construction of the Road are of the best.

THE PASSENGER COACHES ARE OF ELEGANT AND TASTY DESIGN.

Built by the Wagon Manufacturing Co. of Springfield, Mass., the Taintor Car Co. of Taunton, Mass., by Orson Bradley, of Worcester, Mass. and partly at the COMPANY'S OWN SHOPS at CALDER POINT, LONG ISLAND.

They are provided with MILLER'S Patent PLATFORM, COUPLER and BUFFER, SMITH & BAKER'S STEAM HEATER, GRIGGS' WOOD PACKED STEEL TYRE WHEELS, STINNAUD'S Patent Springs and Self-acting BRAKES, under the full control of the engineer.

THE **DEPOTS** are built with a view to the comfort and convenience of the travelling public, and are of most architectural design. They are different in style, pleasing and comfortable to the neighborhood and prominent and odd to attract attention. Several of the Depots are surrounded by large plots of ground, which have been neatly laid out, and serve as public parks, the grounds being kept in order by the R. R. Co.

THE **TRACK** is laid with the best German Street Rails, with suspended joints on a good gravel bed. All the Switches are secured by Titus's Safety Attachment, making it almost impossible for a train to leave the track. Whenever it has been possible the highways are laid over or under the track. All Bridges are of wrought-iron, designed by E. Post, and constructed by the WATSON MANUFACTURING CO., of Paterson, New Jersey.

The following brief description of the principal points touched by the Flushing and North Side R. R. and its branches may be found interesting.

WOODSIDE, within four miles of New York and adjoining Long Island City, is a thriving village, being rapidly built up by mechanics of all trades. The GERMAN CLOTHING MAKER'S UNION have purchased and improved a large tract of land, which is fast filling up with buildings.

WINFIELD, one mile beyond, is so close to **NEWTOWN** that they may be called one village, containing between 3000 and 4000 inhabitants. At the first place there is a metallic coffin manufactory, employing a large number of hands, with which is connected a foundry, where a large proportion of the sewing machine castings for some of the largest concerns in New York City are made. Newtown is quite an old settlement, and the residence of a number of prominent New York Merchants.

WEST FLUSHING or **CONNER**, six miles from Long Island City, is one of the most rapidly growing villages on the road. It has quite extensive porcelain works and a looking-glass and photographic frame manufactory. The Flushing Bay extends to this place, giving freight facilities by water. Two R. R. Depots about one mile apart are established here.

FLUSHING is one of the oldest Dutch settlements on Long Island. It now has a population of about 5,000 inhabitants, which by the almost unimpeded facilities of communication, is rapidly increasing. Flushing lies directly on Flushing Creek, which is navigable some distance above. Extensive BARRI, COALS and LUMBER YARDS are established here, and supply a large section of the Island. The only Bank of deposit in Queens Co., is located at this point. Flushing supports one daily and two weekly papers and has a large number of first-class stores, churches of almost every denomination; a convent, several large boarding schools, a circulating library, and town hall. Gas was introduced a number of years ago and water is about being introduced. Within the village limits the Flushing and North Side R. R. have four depots, all attractive buildings. The R. R. Co. have purchased a large plot of land (25 acres), with over 2,000 feet front on the creek, where they have built extensive docks. This will be their principal point for receiving freight in bulk, such as coal, brick, lumber, etc.

COLLEGE POINT in 1852 had only 5 houses. It now has a population of over 4,000, which is increasing rapidly. The India Rubber Cough Company's Works have been established here since 1854, and employ several hundred hands. The College Point Silk Manufacturing Company, employing nearly 100 hands, and a Steam Flaming and Saw Mill have been established within the last few years. The R. R. Co. have their Repair shops at this point, also their general office. The PORCELAINE DISTRICT erected at a cost of \$100,000, and presented to the Town of Flushing, is at this place. Besides the Railroad, College Point has regular steamboat connection with the city, and a beautiful water front over four miles long, with splendid sites for private residences on Flushing Bay or Long Island Sound. The streets are well regulated, curbed and guttered, sewers and gas-pipes are laid throughout the village, and a special act has been obtained from the legislature for introducing water. College Point has an Episcopal, a Dutch Reformed, a Catholic and a German Lutheran Church. There are also located here two large academies for boys.

WHITESTONE is only two miles beyond College Point. It has an extended water-front on the Long Island Sound, which properly commences at this point. Here we find a large manufactory of tin-ware, and in connection with it the works of the tinplate decorating company (lithography on tin). Whitestone is one terminus of the Flushing and North Side R. R., which when completed to the Sound at this point, will connect with Boston by boat, saving considerable time for passengers wishing to go above 14th street in New York, or to any point on Long Island. Whitestone has a population of 3,000, which is now rapidly increasing. In addition to the Railroad, there are two steamboats running to and from New York regularly. A large hotel situated near the Sound is filled with guests almost all the year round.

CREEDMOOR is the first important point we strike on the Central R. R. of Long Island. Here the National Rifle Association have purchased a large tract of land and erected thereon large embankments and targets. This Range when completed is to be used by the National Guard to practice in the use of firearms. As yet there is no village here, but since the opening of the Railroad, a large number of farms have been laid out in plots, and the rapidity with which these plots have been disposed of, promises a town here within a short time.

HINSDALE, one mile beyond Creedmoor and fifteen miles from Long Island City, is as yet also a prospective city. The village of Queens is only a mile distant, being the junction of a number of roads and thereby quite a prominent point. The R. R. Co., have erected a very ornamental depot, as shown by the accompanying cut.

GARDEN CITY, The centre of operations of Mr. A. T. Stewart's grand enterprise, lies directly on the plains, the most healthy part of Long Island. A large depot and a large number of elegant houses have already been erected here, and a fire-proof hotel to accommodate several hundred guests will be finished in 1874. Streets to the extent of over thirty miles have been built; all well regulated and planted with shade trees. This place is destined to become one of the most prominent places on Long Island.

HEMPSTEAD, almost the oldest settlement on Long Island, and the seat of the first colonial government, is the most interesting town. For over a hundred years there was no marked increase in population, but within a few years it has more than doubled, and now numbers about 6,000. Besides the Central Railroad which has the shortest route, both the Long Island and South Side Railroads have branches running to this village.

BETHPAGE, two miles beyond Farmingdale and thirty miles from the city, is remarkable only for its immense brickyards, owned by Mr. A. T. Stewart, and purchased in connection with the Hempstead Plains enterprise. Fifty millions of brick will be manufactured here in one season.

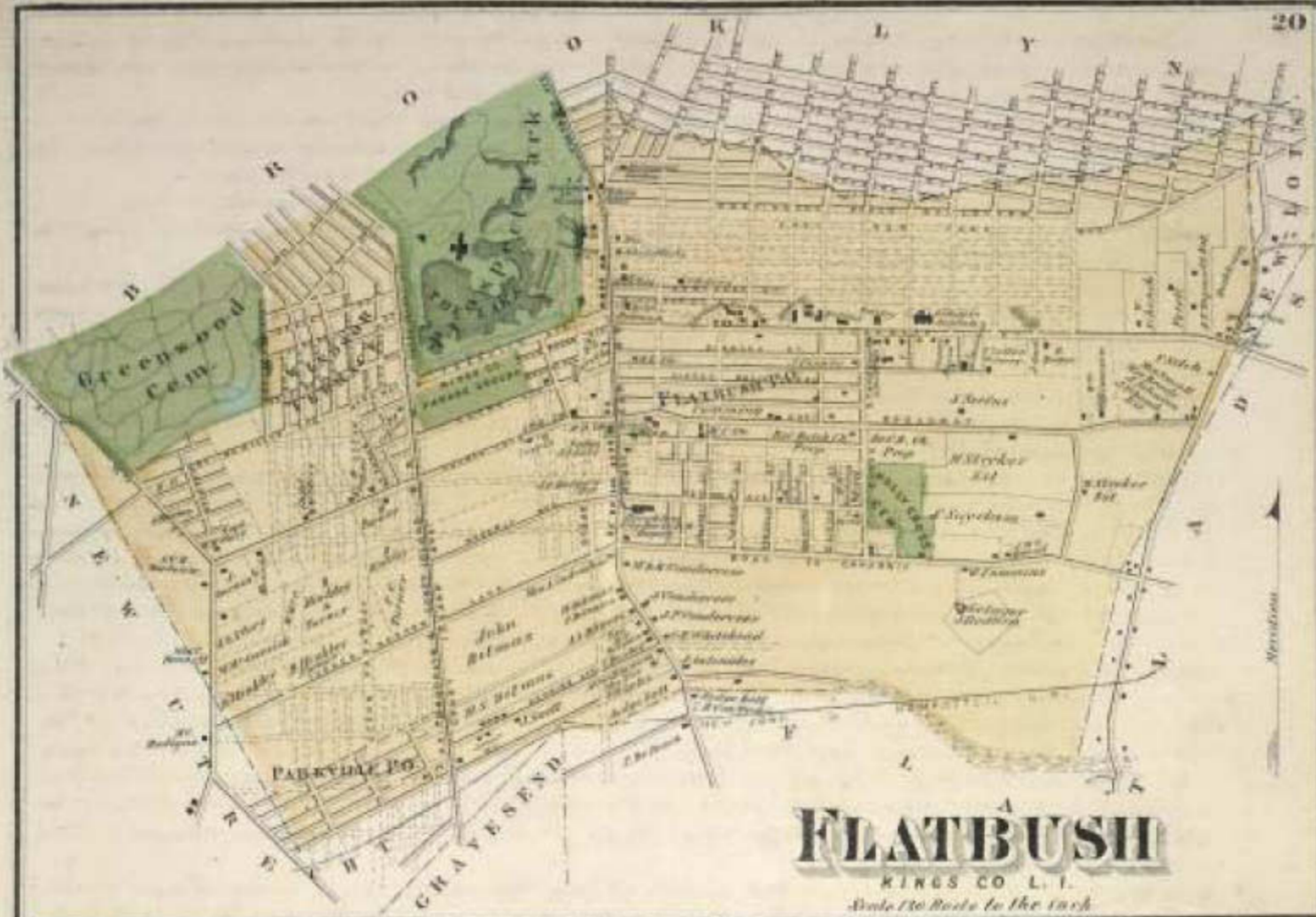

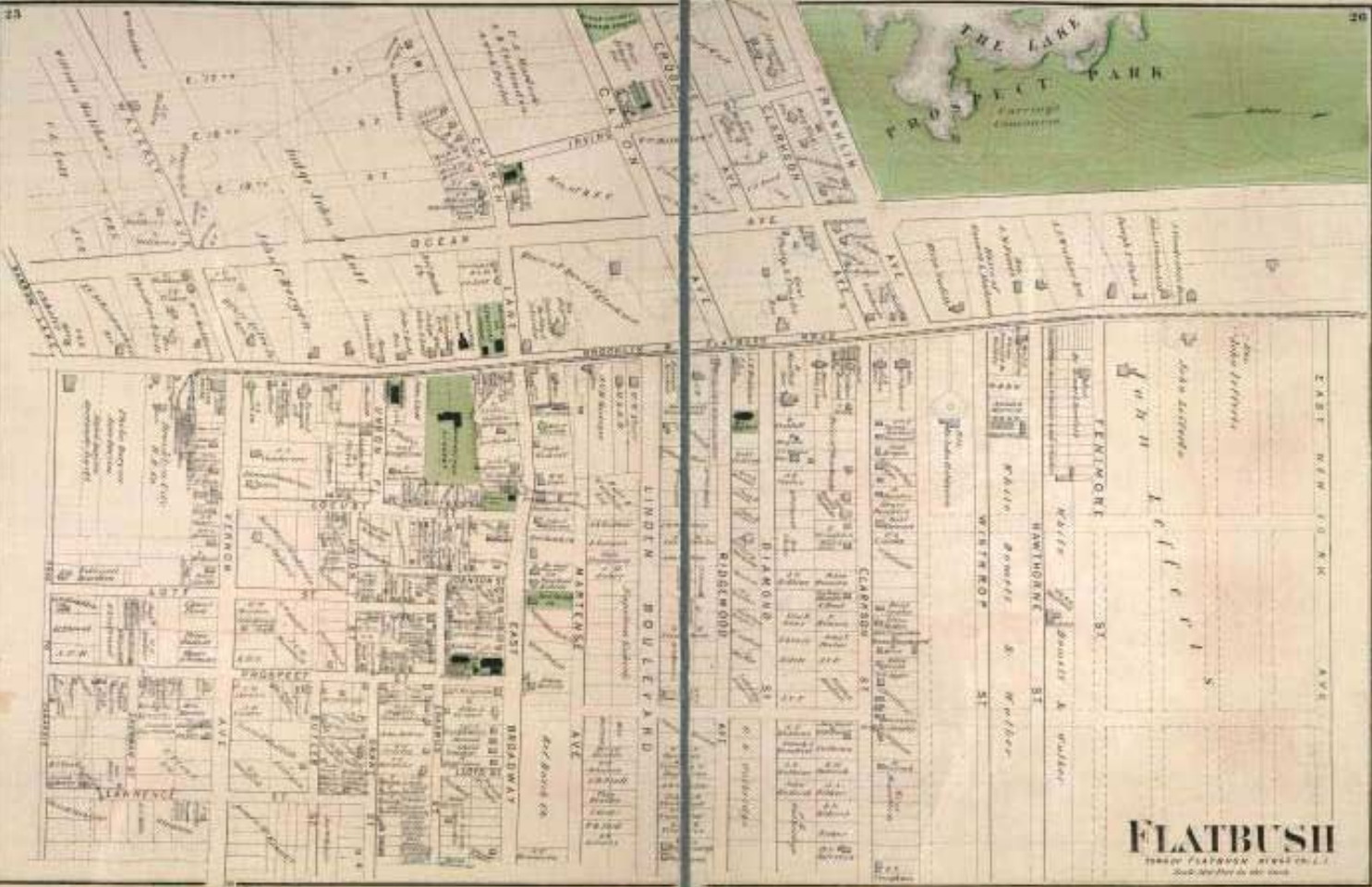


WINDSOR TERRACE

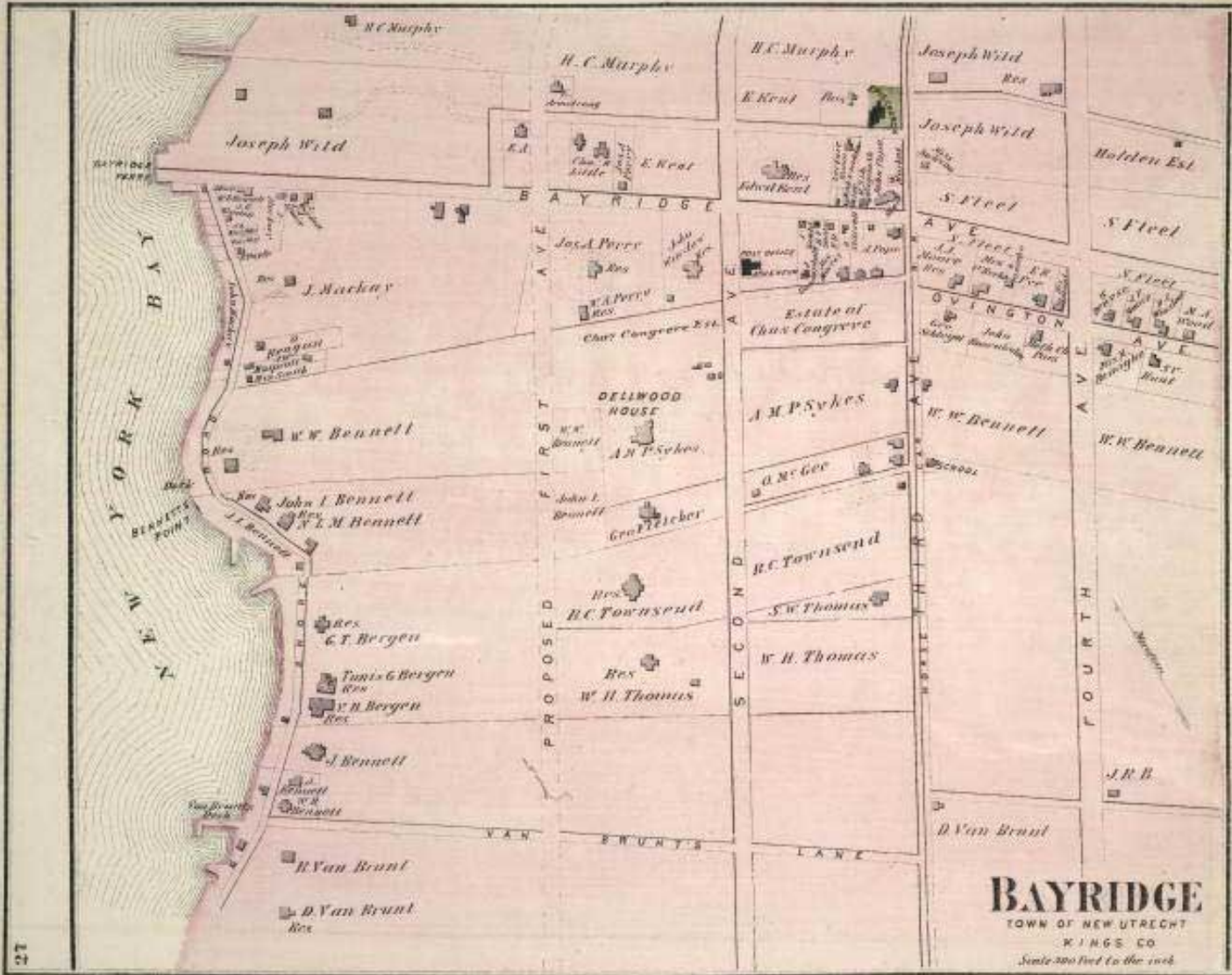

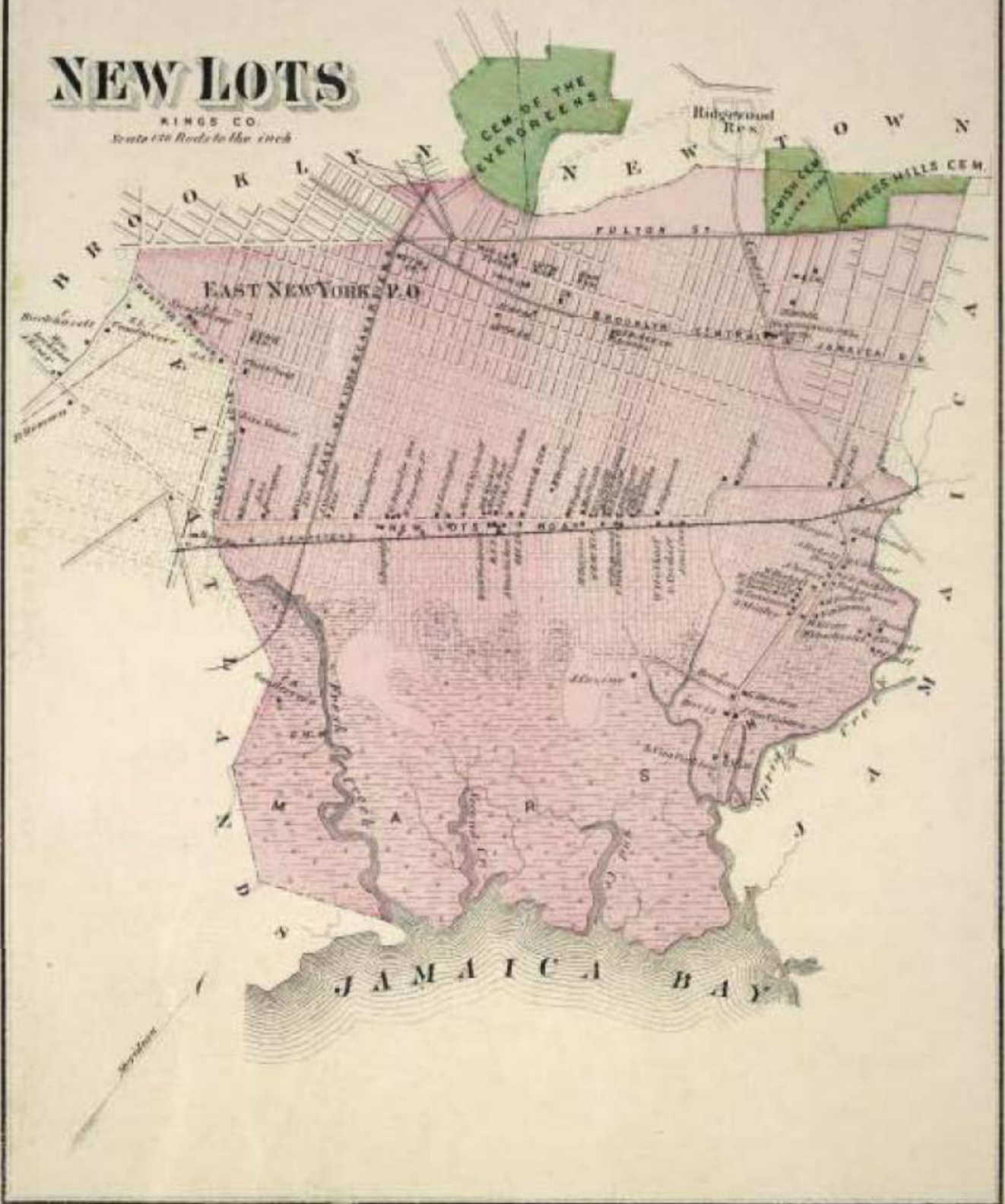

MIDDLE VILLAGE

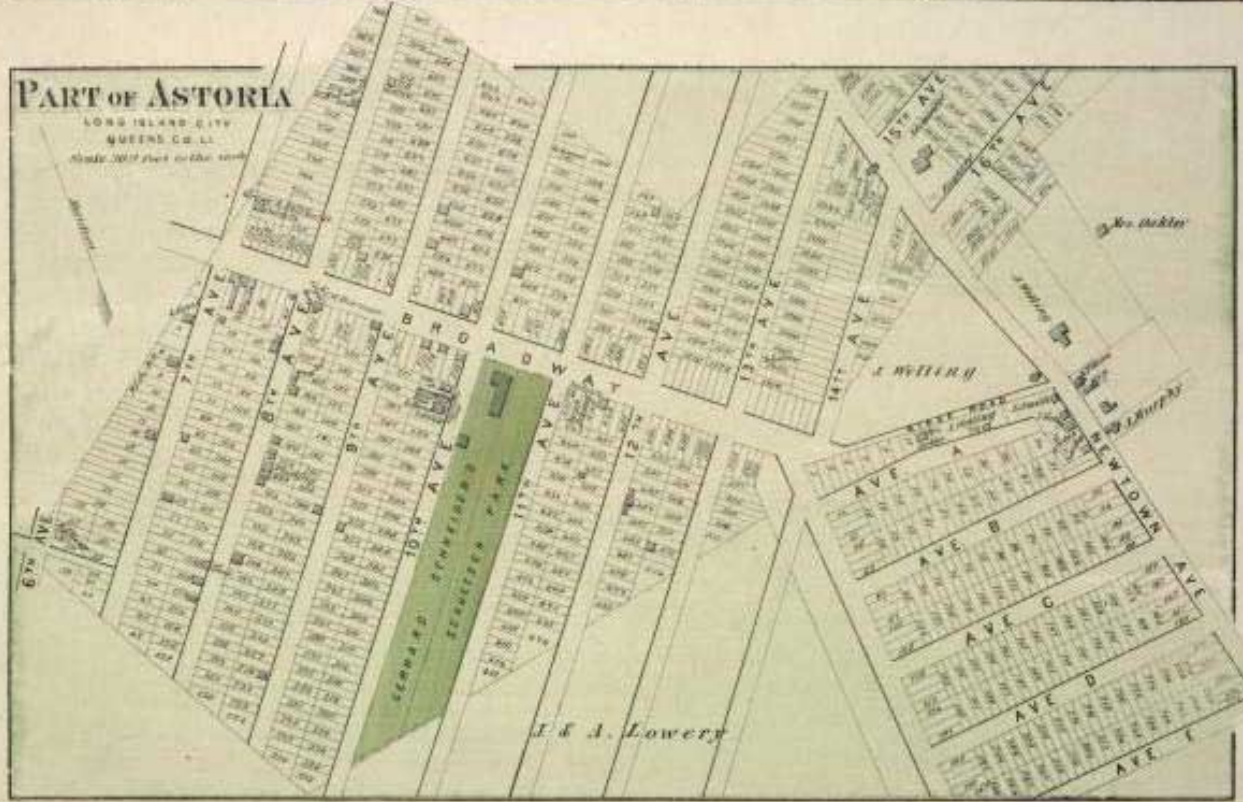

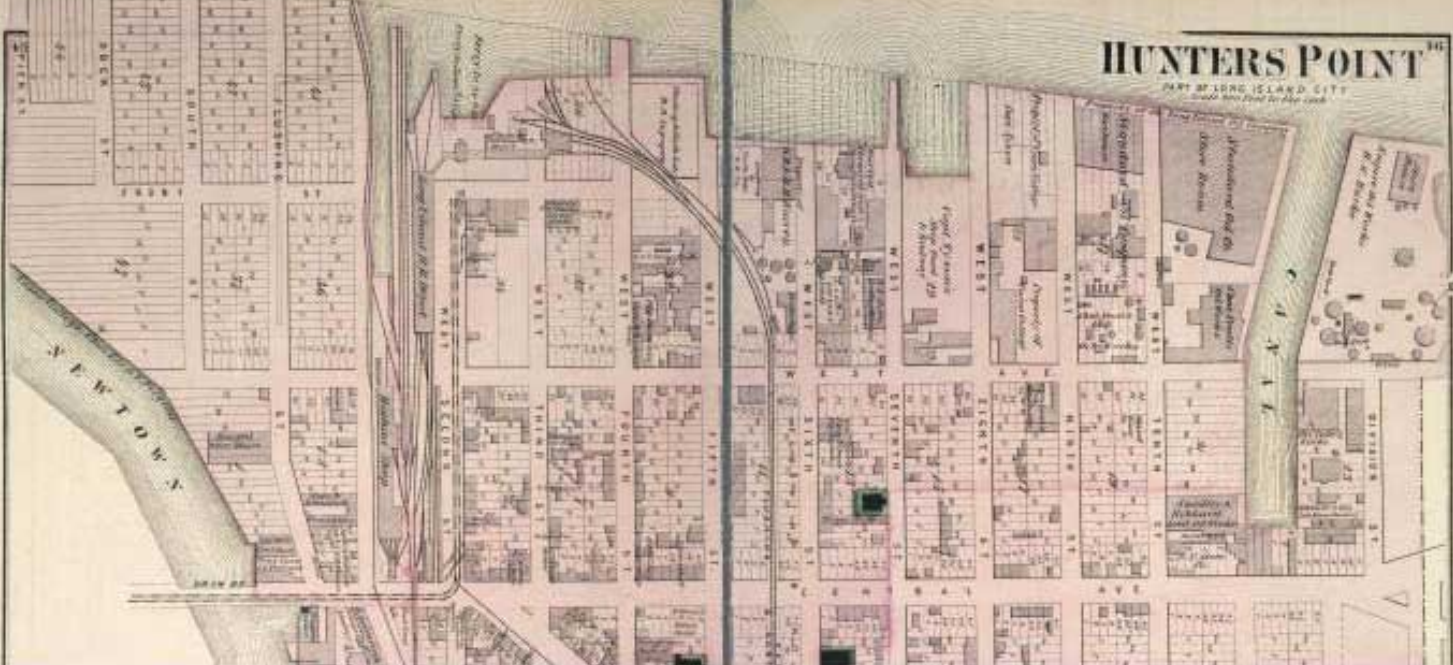
PART OF ASTORIA

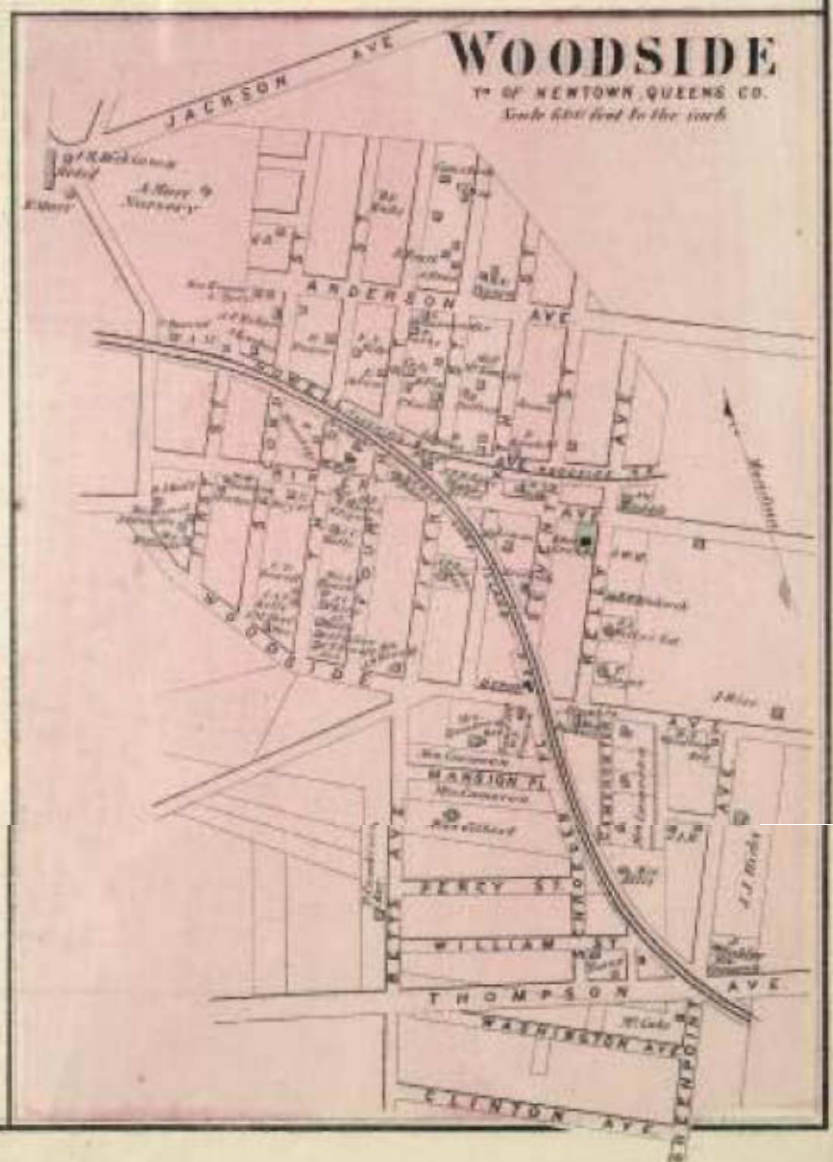

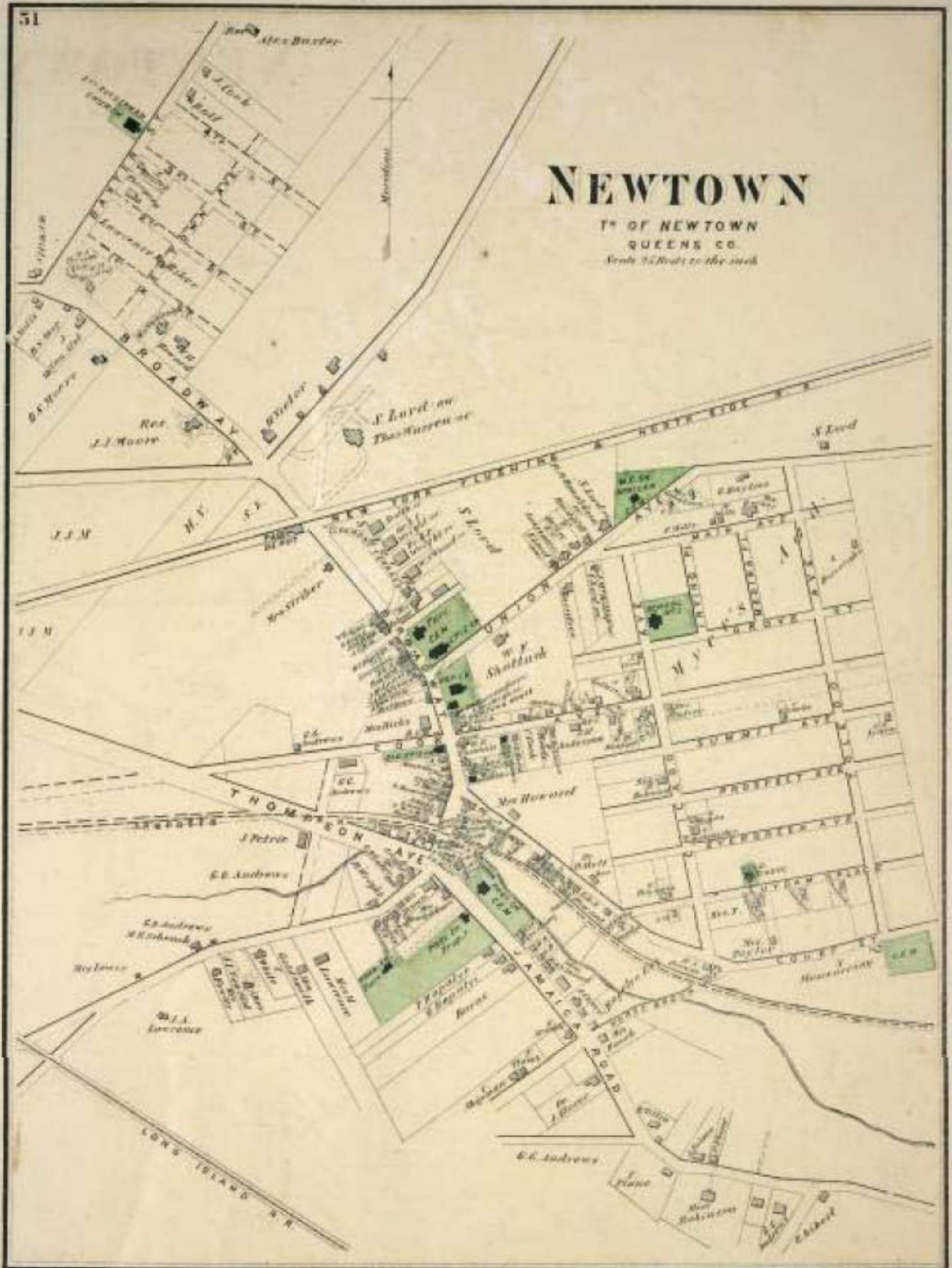

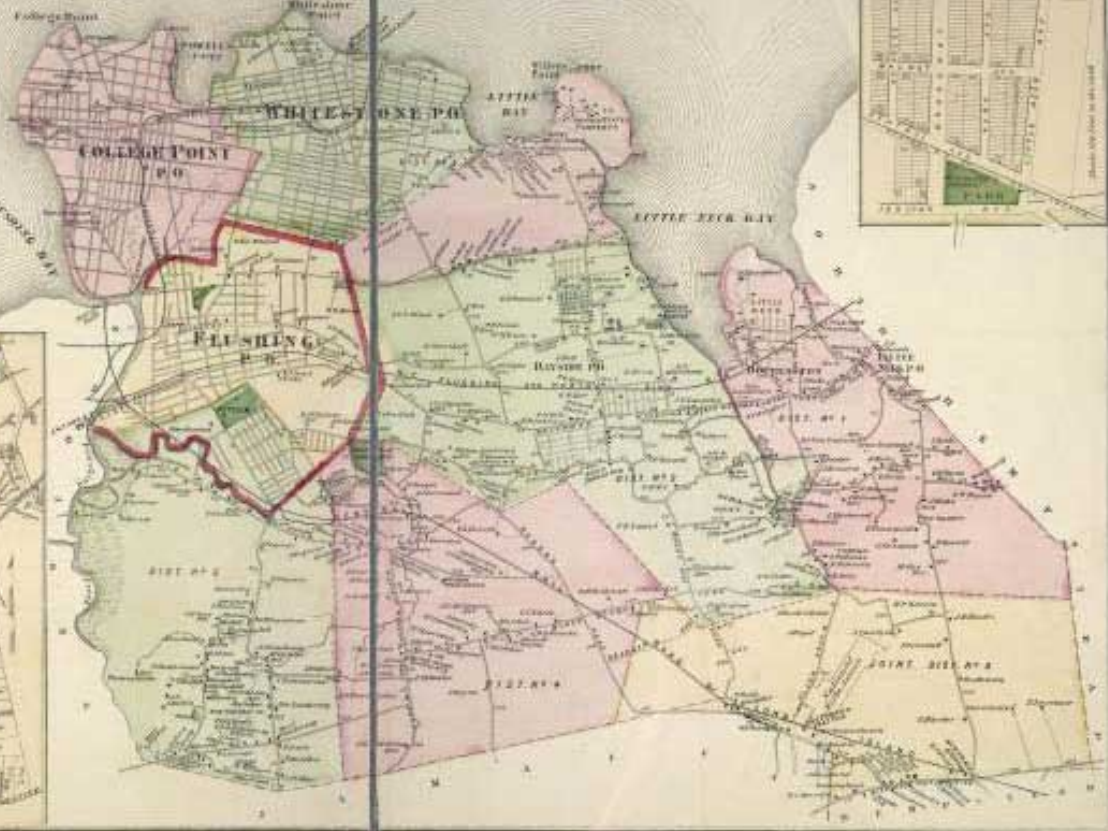

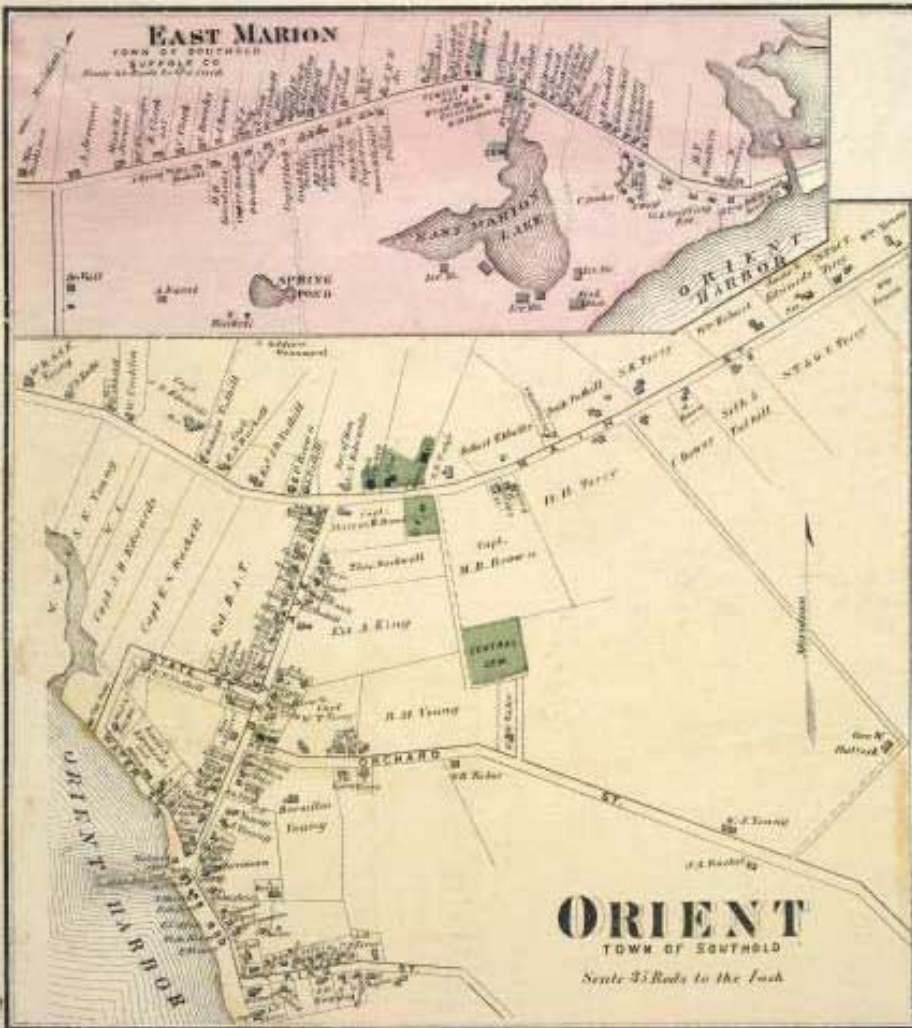


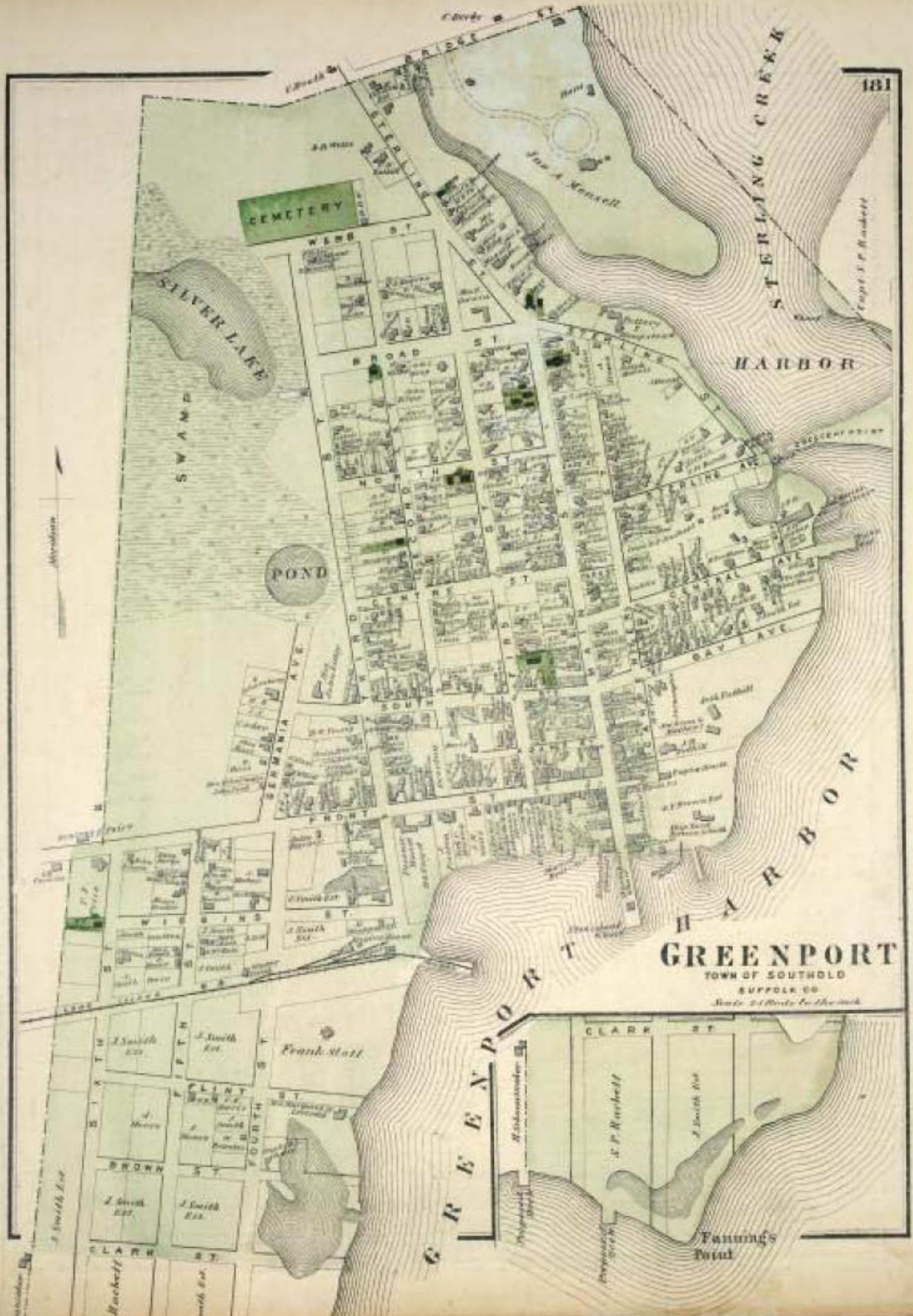




Map of Town of
